LEE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 11-13

(Villages of Pine Island Sewer Service) (CPA2010-00004)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE LEE COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, COMMONLY KNOWN AS THE "LEE PLAN," ADOPTED BY ORDINANCE NO. 89-02, AS AMENDED, SO AS TO ADOPT AMENDMENT PERTAINING TO THE VILLAGES OF PINE ISLAND SEWER SERVICE (CPA2010-00004) APPROVED DURING A PUBLIC HEARING DURING THE COUNTY'S 2010/2011 REGULAR COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT CYCLE; PROVIDING FOR PURPOSE, INTENT, AND SHORT TITLE; AMENDMENTS TO ADOPTED MAP; LEGAL EFFECT OF "THE LEE PLAN"; GEOGRAPHICAL APPLICABILITY; SEVERABILITY, CODIFICATION, SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Lee County Comprehensive Plan ("Lee Plan") Policy 2.4.1. and Chapter XIII, provides for adoption of amendments to the Plan in compliance with State statutes and in accordance with administrative procedures adopted by the Board of County Commissioners ("Board"); and,

WHEREAS, the Board, in accordance with Section 163.3181, Florida Statutes, and Lee County Administrative Code AC-13-6 provide an opportunity for the public to participate in the plan amendment public hearing process; and,

WHEREAS, the Lee County Local Planning Agency ("LPA") held a public hearing on the proposed amendment in accordance with Florida Statutes and the Lee County Administrative Code on February 28, 2011; and,

WHEREAS, the Board held a public hearing for the transmittal of the proposed amendment on June 13, 2011. At that hearing, the Board approved a motion to send, and did later send, proposed amendment pertaining to the Future Sewer Service Areas Map 7 (CPA2010-00004) to the reviewing agencies set forth in Section 163.3184(1)(c), F.S. for review and comment; and,

WHEREAS, at the June 13, 2011 meeting, the Board announced its intention to hold a public hearing after the receipt of the reviewing agencies' written comments; and,

WHEREAS, on September 28, 2011, the Board held a public hearing and adopted the proposed amendment to the Lee Plan set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

SECTION ONE: PURPOSE, INTENT AND SHORT TITLE

The Board of County Commissioners of Lee County, Florida, in compliance with Chapter 163, Part II, Florida Statutes, and with Lee County Administrative Code AC-13-6, conducted public hearings to review proposed Map amendments to the Lee Plan. The purpose of this ordinance is to adopt the Map amendments to the Lee Plan discussed at those meetings and approved by a majority of the Board of County Commissioners. The short title and proper reference for the Lee County Comprehensive Land Use Plan, as hereby amended, will continue to be the "Lee Plan." This amending ordinance may be referred to as the "Villages of Pine Island Sewer Service Areas Map 7 Ordinance (CPA2010-00004)."

SECTION TWO: ADOPTION OF COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT

The Lee County Board of County Commissioners amends the existing Lee Plan, adopted by Ordinance Number 89-02, as amended, by adopting an amendment, known as CPA2010-00004 (Future Sewer Service Areas Map 7). The changes to Map 7 adopted through this Ordinance are attached hereto as Exhibit A.

The Future Sewer Service Areas depicted on Map 7 reflect the portion of Lee County anticipated to be served by wastewater infrastructure by Lee County Utilities within the Planning Horizon (2030).

The Pine Island Waste Water Treatment Plant has capacity available to serve the approved development at build-out.

The proposed amendment to Map 7 of the Lee Plan will not increase allowable densities and intensities of the subject site.

Lee County Utilities has a 12 inch diameter sewage force main that abuts the property within the right-of-way of Stringfellow Road. The force main has been demonstrated through hydraulic calculations on record with Lee County Utilities to have a available capacity to provide adequate service to this project at build-out.

The addition of the site to Map 7 of the Lee Plan will allow Lee County Utilities to serve the mixed use development that includes multi-family residential and commercial development approved through Development Order DOS 83-07-003-00D.

Consistent with Policy 56.2.1, it is in the public interest of preserving public health and of preserving and enhancing environmental quality to have commercial and larger residential developments connect to central sewer when it is available.

The developer has signed a wastewater reuse agreement with Lee County Utilities.

The corresponding Staff Reports and Analysis, along with all attachments for this amendment are adopted as "Support Documentation" for the Lee Plan.

SECTION THREE: LEGAL EFFECT OF THE "LEE PLAN"

No public or private development will be permitted except in conformity with the Lee Plan. All land development regulations and land development orders must be consistent with the Lee Plan as amended.

SECTION FOUR: GEOGRAPHIC APPLICABILITY

The Lee Plan is applicable throughout the unincorporated area of Lee County, Florida, except in those unincorporated areas included in joint or interlocal agreements with other local governments that specifically provide otherwise.

SECTION FIVE: SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this ordinance are severable and it is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Lee County, Florida, to confer the whole or any part of the powers herein provided. If any of the provisions of this ordinance are held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the decision of that court will not affect or impair the remaining provisions of this ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent of the Board that this ordinance would have been adopted had the unconstitutional provisions not been included therein.

SECTION SIX: INCLUSION IN CODE, CODIFICATION, SCRIVENERS' ERROR

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this ordinance will become and be made a part of the Lee County Code. Sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish this intention; and regardless of whether inclusion in the code is accomplished, sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered. The correction of typographical errors that do not affect the intent, may be authorized by the County Manager, or his or her designee, without need of public hearing, by filing a corrected or recodified copy with the Clerk of the Circuit Court.

SECTION SEVEN: EFFECTIVE DATE

The plan amendments adopted herein are not effective until 31 days after the State Land Planning Agency notifies the County that the plan amendment package is complete. If timely challenged, and amendment does not become effective until the State Land Planning Agency or the Administrative Commission enters a final order determining the adopted amendment to be in compliance. No development orders, development permits, or land uses dependent on this amendment may be issued or commence before the amendment has become effective. If a final order of noncompliance is issued by the

Administration Commission, this amendment may nevertheless be made effective by adoption of a resolution affirming its effective status.




EXISTING FUTURE SEWER SERVICE AREA




Exhibit A Sewer Service area Map (Adopted by BOCC 9-28-11)
