

For the record Jason Cull, Lee County Environmental Sciences. I'm here to give you a brief overview of Comprehensive Plan Amendment 2010-12 which proposes to amend the LEE PLAN to update the Conservation Lands Future Land Use designations on the Future Land Use Map.

Currently just over 66,000 acres or 17% of unincorporated Lee County is designated in the Conservation future land use category.

Lands in this amendment include:

- 27 acres acquired by The Florida Audubon Society located in Orange River and Daughtrys Creek
- 123 acres acquired by the DEP located on Cayo Costa
- 351 acres acquired by The Sanibel Captiva Conservation Foundation located on Pine Island, and Captiva
- 28 acres acquired by Lee County Parks and Recreation known as Morse Shores Preserve
- 32 acres acquired by Calusa Land Trust located on Pine Island
- Equals Total 561 acres
- Removal properties include Scott Property within Matlacha which equals 72 acres these properties were incorrectly designated as Conservation Lands will be changed to Wetlands Category

The properties were selected by specific entities and includes areas such as Cayo Costa Pine Island, North Captiva Island, Captiva Island (Buck Key area) Daughtry's Creek, Morse Shores Preserve and Six Mile Cypress Slough.

The additions can be seen in the attached maps pages 1 through 11. Each map region has an existing use and a proposed use. The parcels outlined in red are the additions made in this amendment and the parcels outlined in blue are the removal properties.
