RE: Adoption—Comprehensive Plan Amendment TXT14-0001

Dear Mr. Eubanks:

We hereby submit the adopted Comprehensive Plan amendment TXT14-0001 to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity in accordance with Chapter 163 of the Florida Statutes (F.S.). This amendment is being submitted through the expedited state review process as described in Chapter 163.3184.

Amendment Summary. The primary purpose of this amendment is to adopt an updated Water Supply Facilities Work Plan, consistent with the South Florida Water Management District's update to the Lower West Coast Regional Water Supply Plan. The Cape Coral Water Supply Facilities Work Plan (2009) is incorporated by reference in Policy 2.4.2 of the Infrastructure Element. Adoption of this update is a requirement of s. 163.3177(6)(c), F.S. The secondary purpose of the amendment is to update Objective 2.1, 2.2 and Policy 2.2.1., which will update the list of infrastructure projects to meet Cape Coral's future infrastructure demands, and is consistent with the already-adopted schedule of capital improvements.

Local Planning Agency and the Council public hearings. The Cape Coral Planning and Zoning Commission/Local Planning Agency held a public hearing on transmittal of the amendment on August 6, 2014 and recommended approval. The City Council's transmittal hearing was held on September 8, 2014, whereupon Council unanimously recommended transmittal of the text amendment request. Planning staff recommended approval. No revisions were requested by state and regional review agencies. On December 8, 2014, the proposed amendment was adopted by the Cape Coral City Council.

ORDINANCE 26 - 14

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF CAPE CORAL COMPREHENSIVE PLAN; BY AMENDING THE INFRASTRUCTURE ELEMENT TO UPDATE THE LIST OF INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS AND TO ADOPT AN UPDATED WATER SUPPLY FACILITIES WORK PLAN; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF CAPE CORAL, FLORIDA, HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City of Cape Coral hereby adopts a Comprehensive Plan amendment necessary to update the Comprehensive Plan as follows:

Amending the Infrastructure Element by updating the list of infrastructure projects to remove those projects that have been completed and to reflect the updated schedule of capital improvements and by adopting an updated Water Supply Facilities Work Plan. The amendment to the Infrastructure Element is described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Severability. In the event that any portion or section of this Ordinance is determined to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall in no manner affect the remaining portions or sections of this Ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. Effective Date. The effective date of this plan amendment shall be thirty-one (31) days after the state land planning agency notifies the City that the plan amendment package is complete, or if timely challenged, the date a final order is issued by the Administration Commission finding the amendment to be in compliance in accordance with Chapter 163.3184(3)(c)4., F.S., whichever is applicable.

INFRASTRUCTURE ELEMENT

GOALS, OBJECTIVES, AND POLICIES

GOAL 2: Provision of Sanitary Sewer, Drainage, Potable Water, and Solid Waste Services - the City of Cape Coral will provide sanitary sewer, drainage, and potable water facilities, and will coordinate with private and County sources for provision of solid waste facilities to meet the existing and projected needs identified in this plan.

Objective 2.1: Existing deficiencies will be corrected by undertaking the following projects:

- a) Sanitary Sewer <u>and Potable Water</u>
 Implement SW-4 Utility Expansion Program
- b) Drainage

Complete CRA Phase II Stormwater Improvements
Implement recommendations of the Master Storm Water Management Plan

- <u>Policy 2.1.1.</u> All projects will be undertaken in accordance with the Five Year Schedule of Capital Improvements adopted as part of the Capital Improvements Element.
- <u>Policy 2.1.2.</u> Projects needed to correct existing deficiencies will be given priority in the formation and implementation of the Capital Improvements Plan.

Objective 2.2: Projected demands through the year 2013-2018 will be met.

Policy 2.2.1.

The City will meet projected demands by undertaking the following projects within the short-term planning timeframe:

- a. Sewer and Water Projects
 - 1. Continue to provide planning and studies necessary for orderly expansion
 - 2. Southwest 4 Utility Expansion Program—North 1 Utility Expansion Program
 - 3. Southwest 5 Utility Expansion Program-North 2 Utility Expansion Program
 - 4. Southwest 6 Utility Expansion Program
 - 5. Southwest 7 Utility Expansion Program
 - 6. Construct North Cape Water Reclamation Facility
 - 7. Construct North Cape Reverse Osmosis Plant

Policy 2.4.2. 2.3.5.
