BoCC Direction:

□ Amend the Lee Plan to:

- □ Streamline and clarify Lee Plan provisions.
- □ Reduce redundancies by removing regulatory provisions.
- □ Eliminate potential legal challenges.

Proposed Amendments:

- Delete Map 14: Future Limerock Mining Overlay.
 - Limerock mines will not be required to be identified on Map 14.
 - Appropriateness of location will be determined through the rezoning process.
- Eliminate the County's obligation to provide a limerock market analysis.
 - The County will not be required to provide limerock to meet regional demand.
- Delete Objective 33.1 and relocate clarified language to Goal 10.
 - Remove wetland impact exemptions.
 - Provide meaningful and predictable standards.

Natural Resources/Compatibility:

- The MEPD rezoning process will continue to protect natural resources and compatibility with surrounding land uses.
 - Lee Plan requires protection of natural resources and assurance of compatibility: Policies 1.4.5, 1.5.1, 5.1.5, 114.1.1, 135.9.5, & 139.5.6; Objective 33.2 and its subsequent policies; and, Goals 7 & 10 and their subsequent provisions.
 - Chapter 12 requires evaluation of potential impacts of mining on:
 - Agricultural and residential uses, and environmentally sensitive areas:
 - Noise
 - Dust
 - Light
 - Ground-water quality and quantity
 - Surface-water flow and quality
 - Estero and Imperial Rivers
 - Estero Bay
 - Transportation infrastructure
 - Wildlife habitat

Conclusion and Recommendation:

- The amendments to the Lee Plan are consistent with the Board of County Commissioner's direction to:
 - □ Streamline and clarify Lee Plan provisions.
 - Reduce redundancies by removing regulatory provisions.
 - □ Eliminate potential legal challenges.
- Staff recommends that the BoCC transmit the proposed amendments for state review.
