In accordance with the provisions of F.S. Chapter 163.3184(3) for Expedited State Review, please find attached the proposed Comprehensive Plan Amendment. known locally as CPA2022-00005 (Pine Island Preserve at Matlacha Pass). The amendment is as follows:

CPA2022-00005, Pine Island Preserve at Matlacha Pass:

Amend Lee Plan Policy 24.4.4 to clarify its limited applicability to commercial development. The request does not change the uses or intensities allowed in the Coastal Rural future land use category, nor does it change design standards or the review process required for approval of commercial uses within the Coastal Rural future land use category. (Adopting Ordinance 22-28).

The Lee County Board of County Commissioners held an adoption hearing to adopt the above identified ordinance for the plan amendment on November 2, 2022. As required by F.S. 163.3184(3)(c), the final action on this amendment was completed within 180 days of the receipt of the state land planning agency's report.
