
Individual Transaction Seems Small

I. CALOOSAHATCHEE RIVER IS CONTAMINATED*


- 1. 2017 2-year BMAP Study High Levels of Bacteria, Nitrogen, and Phosphorous
 - a. Human wastewater from septic system is impacting our water ways
- 2. FDEP has identified Conventional Septic Systems are the Source of Contamination



Lee County to meet Regulatory Requirements

Countywide Wastewater Management Plan – Septic Conversion

- > Required Conventional Septic Tank Conversion
 - 71,916 Septic Tanks in Lee County.
 - 14,946 in Lee County Utility and BMAP
 - 3,768 Septic tanks (within 1-mile of river)
 - 1. Must be converted to Municipal Sewer
 - 2. Cost estimate_\$57,000 per home paid by owner






Lee County Utilities Recommended <u>Individual Advanced</u>


